Dues and Don't!

Each year in January your Roma Lodge dues are due. 15 years ago we voted to increase the dues to \$50 of which Roma Lodge received \$3.20. Since then we have increased the dues 50% to \$75 and our lodge gets **25 cents!** The rest is passed on to the Grand Lodge and OSIA.

Before you write out that check for yourself, maybe your children, perhaps your grandchildren you may want to decide if you are getting your money's worth.



From the local lodge you are getting a great deal for your 25 cents. If you attend 11 meetings, Columbus Day, Ravioli Dinner, Farm Show and Christmas Party you are getting over \$200 worth of meals alone. Pretty good return on your investment.

We have numerous members who live out of state, live more than an hour from our lodge meeting sites, elderly or having health issues who just cannot attend.

Please do not interpret these comments as if we want you to dropout of the lodge because you cannot participate in lodge activities. We just want you to realize you are not financially supporting the local lodge a great deal with your 25 cents. It costs the lodge \$20 a year just to send you this newsletter each month. You will have to decide on your own what benefits you get from the Grand Lodge and OSIA for the other \$74.75 you pay in dues each year.

Speaking of dues this year we have 15 members who still had not paid their 2018 dues by December. This means that the lodge had to pay \$56 to keep them on the membership rolls for the Grand Lodge. If those members do not pay for their dues and dropout in December then the lodge would be out \$840 for these members.

We will be considering whether or not to carry members who have not paid their dues by the end of the first quarter so they can be dropped and it will not cost the lodge for Grand Lodge and OSIA dues.

As individuals we all need to weigh the benefits of being a Roma Lodge member. Many of our families have been part of the lodge for 89 years. We all have to decide if we pay our dues or don't!

Membership Dues

Your lodge dues are due on January 1, 2019. Regular member dues are \$75 with the mortuary (\$60 without) per year. Social members are the same. Juniors with benefits are \$6.36. Junior members who choose not to select the benefit option are free. College students up to the age of 26 are also free if they verify they are in college by sending a letter to the lodge.
