making of the sauce along with his sons **Josh**, **Dominic and Michael**.

Roma Lodge has come a long way since we hosted 1,250 people at our 25th dinner at the Tulare Fair Grounds which featured dancing and homemade ravioli for only \$3 per person.



If we go back 25 years our dinner chairs were Nancy and Charlie Pitigliano along with Mary Louise Yribarren. Charlie and Nancy were instrumental in this years dinner

showing that many of our members have a long history of organizing our dinner. If you look at the pictures from back then you will see members like Josh Pitigliano who was just a kid helping make sauce. For over 85 years the lodge has promoted our Italian Culture to the people of Tulare County. Have times and traditions changed. YES!



Do we have members today with enough time to grow flowers to decorate tables, make homemade ravioli, have junior members dress up in heavily starched butler outfits to serve our great meal and provide dancing for our patrons?
