Charlie Pitigliano was inducted into the College of the Sequoias Foundation Hall of Fame on October 5th at the Porter Field House on the COS Campus. COS is just one of the many, many community organizations that Charlie has supported over the years. He serves as the



chair of the COS Farm Operations committee along with Vince Sola, another Roma Lodge member.

As part of his induction ceremony a little history of Charlie's Italian heritage was introduced which many of us in Roma Lodge may not know.

Charlie's paternal grandfather, Camillio Pitigliano came to America in the 1890's and worked as a blaster in the manganese mines located in Porterville on Lewis Hill. He later became a dairy farmer in the 1940's in Tulare. The Pitigliano family comes from the small town of Pitigliano, in the Province of Grosseto, Italy. Charlie's maternal grandfather, Benjamin Lapadula, came to America in 1909 from Florence, Italy and settled in the Los Angeles area working as a groundskeeper at a local cemetery.

While working at the cemetery a woman's husband passed away and she asked that Benjamin take special care of her husband's grave and she would stop by every couple of weeks to check on him. As time went on they became good friends because they both spoke Italian and she was always impressed by the way he took care of the cemetery grounds.

The woman became elderly and she asked Benjamin if he would be interested in managing a piece of property she owned in the Tipton-Pixley area in the San Joaquin Valley. After some careful thought, he decided to move to Pixley to manage the farm growing cotton, corn and alfalfa. Again, the woman was impressed with his farming skills and decided to sell the property to him. He explained he could not afford it and she reassured him that he could. He took over the property and with the help of Boswell farms he share-cropped the farm until it was paid for. The Lapadula farm was established in 1925 on 640 acres which is part of the family operation today.


Charlie's family story is one of many of Italian immigrants who came to the central valley, worked hard, and built their families American dream in this coun-

try. As mentioned in his induction ceremony, Charlie leads his community from the kitchen and not the podium. He leads from behind the scenes and reluctantly



touts his own accomplishments. Charlie is usually the first to arrive at Roma Lodge activities and the last to leave.

Charlie indicates his favorite pastime is taking a raw piece of land and developing it into a permanent crop. I believe his favorite pastime is encouraging, mentoring and providing resources to his family, friends, employees and members of his community to take their raw talents and build upon them to become
