Making it a priority!

t is that time of the year when we take stock in where we have been and where we are headed as an organization. I thought it would be a good time to do some analysis of our membership.

As shown in the chart above about 8% of our membership are 80 or over in age. While our largest group of members are from the age of 40-60. We have the largest group of junior members of any lodge in the state so we have a bright future.

The two columns in the middle illustrate whether these age groups are "Active" or "Inactive" in the lodge. So what does that mean? If you have attended a meeting, Christmas Party, worked at the food booth at the World Ag Expo or helped out at the ravioli dinner drive-thru you are considered an active member. If you paid your dues and never attended a meeting or activity you are considered an inactive member.

So lets look a little deeper. To begin with we cannot expect those members 80 or over to be at every meeting, make sausage sandwiches at the farm show or stir sauce at the ravioli dinner. Many suffer from health issues and nearly 1/3 don't even live in Tulare County!

Of our 20-40 age group over 85% of them live outside of Tulare County with some living in other states, Kern County or Fresno County. It makes it difficult for them to participate in monthly activities. Why do we have so many members who live outside of Tulare County? These our members who parents or grandparents our long time members who have continued their membership. These young members have gone to college or moved out of state and con-

tinue their membership in the lodge.

So what is the point? Last week at the WAE food booth we had over 50 members who either showed up on Sunday to cook onions, cooked sausage or pasta, made sandwiches or served ravioli or waited on customers. We had plenty of help on Sunday and Wednesday, however, we could have used more help on Tuesday and Thursday.

We have about 275 members of Roma Lodge and with over 20% of them living outside of Tulare County having a 45% participation rate is pretty good. However, we would like more help during the farm show or we are going to have to partner with another group to continue our participation at the show.

It is once again time to pay your dues for the year. All of us have to assess whether or not we want to continue our membership in the lodge. For the past 95 years the lodge has continued to represent our Italian Culture and continue to show the community we are very proud of that culture.

I know each of us will have to prioritize our participation in lodge activities when I know our young parents have a lot on their schedule and it is often difficult to make time for our monthly meetings or participate in lodge activities like the WAE food booth or ravioli dinner drive through.

The best return on your investment for your dues is to attend monthly meetings and participate in lodge activities. We need to all make these activities a priority in the future!
