After 80+ years Roma Lodge broke with some long held traditions by having a "drive through only" ravioli dinner. Declining numbers of inside diners and



the costs associated with having a band, decorations, table clothes, etc., etc. it made sense to explore the idea of a drive through dinner.

There was some lost ticket sales from those who wanted a sit down option however with dropping the price to \$20 increased sales resulted in nearly 800 dinners being served. The final budget will be discussed at the June meeting but all indications are that the dinner was a big success.

Co-chairs *Cathy Mederos* and *Ken Curti* are to

be thanked for all their efforts in coordinating the event. Special thanks goes to Charlie Pitigliano who had to step in for Kenny after he had major back surgery just a week before the event. About 50 members showed up to make the dinner a success. **Dennis** *Mederos* coordinated the drive through lanes with signs and lane barriers. It takes a lot of hard work to make the dinner a success and everyone commented the drive through was a big plus with participants able to stay in their cars and had to only

ast June in my Herald's message I wrote about a reporters 5 W's when reporting on a news event. Who, What, When, Where and Why and how these items must be included in in an effective news story. I also documented how these principles of good reporting relate to our annual ravioli dinner.

We pretty much agreed that **Why** we did the dinner was because it is our major fundraiser, **Who** it was for, was the community to understand what the lodge does in carrying on the Italian traditions and **What** should the price be if we did only take outs?

The *Why* and *Who* remained the same and the *What* changed the price to \$20 and a drive through which turned out to be a big success with nearly 200 more dinners being served at this years event. Everyone I sold tickets to loved the drive through and the food! They were so glad they did not have to leave their car and stand in line to wait for their dinners.

So that leaves two W's to consider for our next dinner. The first is *Where*. The TDES Hall has been upgraded and is an outstanding venue for the dinner. It has an ideal location, easily accessible, plenty of kitchen space and outdoor areas to do the cooking.

Cathy Mederos has an excellent working relationship with the group and they were very accommodating and charged us for only the use of the kitchen and bar areas which was a big savings on expenses. However, the hall had a big function on Friday evening, our dinner on Saturday and a Mother's Day Sunday Brunch the day after our event. Is it time to consider discussing the **Where** in our 5 W's?

Finally, how about *When*? A cursory look at the local newspaper indicated there were dozens of events going on during the weekend of the dinner. Everything from fundraisers, high school proms, graduations, weddings and of course Mother's Day!

We are asking a lot of our members to work at the dinner when they may have to prepare a meal the next day for Mother's Day or travel a long distance to be with their mothers. I think we can all agree there are *too many events going on in May!*

Eighty-plus years ago I do not know why the annual ravioli dinner was held in May on Mother's Day weekend. I do know each year the members who put in long hours to put on the event often mention they have many other activities to do the same weekend and have to find time to help with the dinner. Some members can't help at all because of other events or activities they are involved with their families.

We have always referred to the dinner as the "May" dinner. I guess if 80 years ago we had the dinner in August it would be the "August" dinner and if it were in March it would be the "March" dinner.

If you look in the *IILeone* other lodges hold

their major fundraising dinners in conjunction with a major Italian event or American Holiday. Some have a St.



Patrick's Dinner, others Mardi Gras celebration dinner or Columbus Day and choose not to name it after one of the months of the year.

Currently we do not have a chairperson for our annual Columbus Day celebration. Other than the members of Roma Lodge and a number of banks who close, few if any people even pay attention to Columbus Day.

The past several years the Columbus Holiday has been under attack with opponents wanting to do away with the Christopher Columbus holiday and and call it *Indigenous Peoples Day* which has already occurred in many cites and states across America.

So if we held our annual ravioli dinner on Columbus Day weekend each year we would be tying our dinner to the month that Columbus discovered America on October 12, 1492 which would at least give our dinner more credence into carrying on the Italian Culture. *Let's think about it!*

Teacher of the Year Part Deux!




