Presidents Message

"This is not a beauty contest. It is a monetary achievement contest where lodges have the opportunity through a benefit to obtain certain positions" as stated in item #22 of the **Grand Lodge Royal Pageant Contest Rules!**



I can hear **Bert Parks** singing it now. There she is, Miss Monetary Achievement...Uh?

I have received the official announcement and contest rules for the Grand Lodge Royal Pageant Contest for

2019-2020.

The contest officially begins on September 30th so we will have to decide if Roma Lodge plans to participate in this years contest at our October meeting.

To give you a Cliff Notes synopsis of the contest a local lodge representative would have to have a minimum of \$2,000 in ticket sales to participate. The Grand Lodge gets 25% of the **net** proceeds of which the Junior Members activities get 5%. The top 5 contestants get 10%, 8%, 6%, 4% and 2% respectively and in 2018 local lodges received 51.680% of the net proceeds.

Total ticket sales were \$94,855 of which \$57,208 (60.3%) came from three lodges in the Central Valley (**Visalia, Hanford and Tulare**). If you purchased a ticket you had a 1 in 113,822 chance to win from 1 to 10 cash prizes.

The Grand Lodge netted \$15, 515.21, the top five contestants received a total of \$5,669.50 and participating lodges received a total of \$48,992.07 of the net proceeds of \$65,327.20.

Now, before we run out and solicit a queen/king for the Royal Pageant **"monetary achievement contest"** we must ask ourselves what does Roma Lodge get out of the pageant?

In the 2018 contest our queen had \$11,822 in ticket sales. The lodge accomplished this by her efforts, selling tickets, having garage sales, raffles and a variety of other activities to support our queen.

The lodge chose to invest \$5,911 of the total and we received a **net** return for our efforts of **\$198.61**. What? Less than \$200 for a Miss California Title in the **"monetary achievement con-**

test". ***That is a 1.6% return on our investment.***

Our beautiful Roma Lodge Queen, **Gianna Benedetti**, has represented the lodge for the past two years as her sisters **Isabella** and **Gabrielle** did before her. All three held the **Miss California** Title for the Grand Lodge.

As I mentioned in my convention report let's make our Royal Pageant contest something our members can be proud of. Judge contestants on personality, intelligence, speaking ability, cognitive skills and if you still have to have raffle tickets only make that a small portion of the scorecard.

Get three community judges from the site of the convention to do the judging, have final interview questions at the Black and White Ball and select your winners.

During the convention have several workshops on speaking, makeup, dress and other self-esteem builders. How many of our young people would not become a queen contestant because they had to sell tickets?

We are doing a disservice to our junior members, who may want to be our queen/king, by having them sell tickets and being part of the **"monetary achievement contest"** so they can raise money for the Grand Lodge. There is something wrong with having a local lodge "buy" a Grand Lodge Title.

These comments have nothing to do with the outstanding young people who have competed in the past. They have all been well qualified and deserving as representatives of the local and Grand Lodge.

As an organization we can do a lot better in making this a learning experience to improve self-esteem, speaking abilities, cognitive skills and a contest that relies more on ability rather than selling raffle tickets!

As Roma Lodge members we must decide what type of experience we want our young people to have as a representative of our lodge. We shall see!

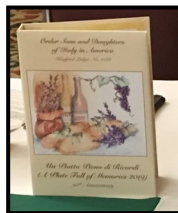


Hanford Celebrates 90th Anniversary
