You may think the \$75 you pay for your dues each year goes to Roma Lodge, which is not the case.



Roma Lodge only gets \$.25 cents with the rest going to the OSDIA and the Grand Lodge. The Grand Lodge gets \$53.23 of the dues you pay. This is why it is important to be represented at the Grand Lodge convention to ensure your dues are being used in your best interest!

Tina Sparlin and I represented Roma Lodge at the convention. Our lodge is allotted 5 delegates. The cost to send each delegate is about \$1,200 so we saved the lodge about \$3,600 and with our bylaw change from last year removing fines we are money ahead.

Pam Ricci of the Cristoforo Colombo Lodge #1534 and her committee served as hosts for the convention at the Silver Legacy Hotel and Casino in downtown Reno. The accommodations, food and venue were outstanding and everyone who attended enjoyed their stay in Reno.

The highlight of each convention is the annual scholar-ship night. *Mark Rossi*, CAO of the Western Foundation does an outstanding job in presenting over \$40,000 in scholarships along with local lodges who donate to a variety of charities at the Saturday morning session.

ast year I was able to celebrate my 75th birthday with family and friends on my mom and dad's patio where I had so many birthday parties as a kid. The house was build by my dad and his brother *John Dutto Jr.* who learned construction in his high school woodshop class. The house was originally built on the dairy site owned by my grandfather John Dutto who immigrated from Italy in the early 1900's. When my mom and dad purchased the adjacent 40-acres the house was pulled across the field by our neighbors tractor crawler.

Birthdays were always special with my aunt *Anna Dutto* (*The best cake maker ever!*) baking my favorite German chocolate cake with pecan frosting. Those were special times!

Today, I'm at the farm and often sit under the patio thinking

about those early days. Now, I'm out spraying weeds in the almonds and I always go into my parents garage, where we used to make homemade Italian Sausage, and wash my hands at the sink where my dad did for over 40 years. Still sitting on the soap tray is a bar of *green soap* I use to wash my hands, just as he did for so many years.

I have often said the reason I have taken a leadership role in Roma Lodge is because I'm trying to preserve their memory and so many other great Italian-

Americans and American-Italians of this community.

My grandfather, John Dutto Sr. was president of the lodge in 1943-44 and my dad Laurence Dutto was lodge

president in 1948-49. If you look in our lodge directory you will find all the names of the Italians of this com-

munity who have preserved our heritage and culture for almost 95-years. When you attend the Grand

Lodge convention you will find countless others who are trying to do the same thing. If we do nothing else, we need to acknowledge those who have come before us and honor their sacrifices.

In 1999 there were 72 lodges at the Grand Lodge convention and 285 officers and delegates. In 2023 there were 107 officers and delegates and only 38 lodges with 6 lodges without representation. Something has to change or there will no longer be a Grand Lodge.
